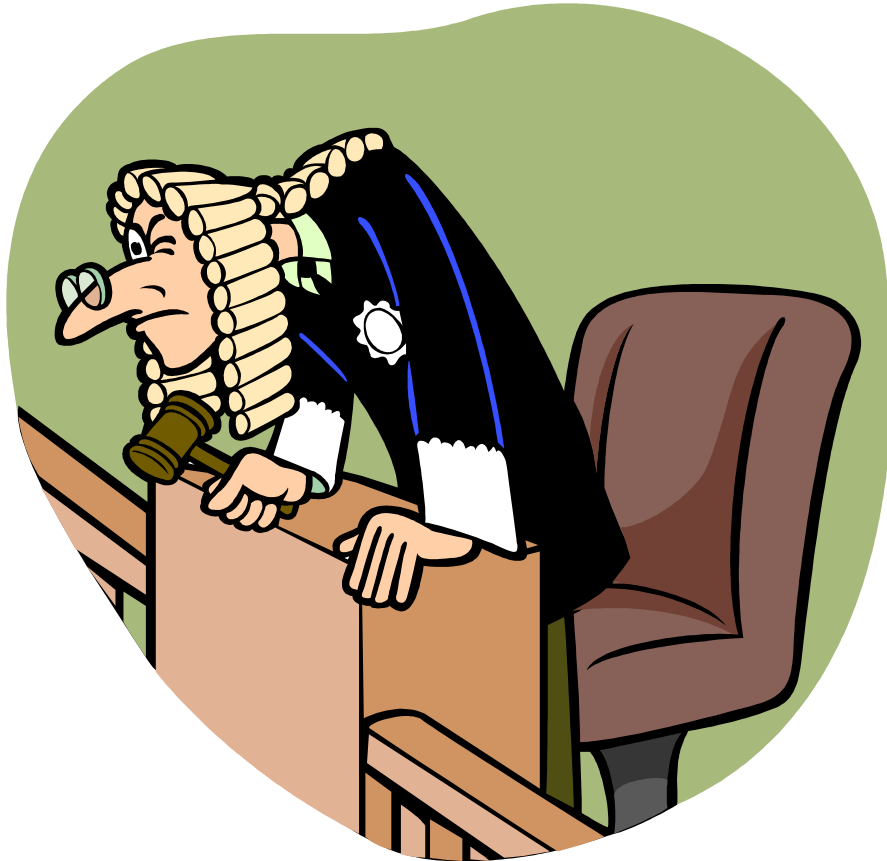


Do Not Judge
