The fruit of the womb is a reward. Like arrows in the hand of a warrior, So are the children of one's youth.




Psalm 127:3-4

Happy is the man who has his man who has his quiver full of them; they shall not be ashamed, But shall speak ashamed, But shall speak with their enemies in the gate.

This activity is representative of a quiver and its arrows. It can be used as a stand alone take home activity or added to the project folder for the books of poetry. After forming the pocket (quiver) described to the right, children will write names of their siblings on arrows (printed from cardstock) and put them in the "quiver".

This is the back of the Psalm 127 activity and should be copied on regular copy paper. You can use cardstock if it is to be a stand alone take home activity. Fold in half and glue on dashed lines to form a pocket. Fold solid line back to form opening for the "quiver". Glue activity onto tall section of project folder.



Print on cardstock and cut out. Give each student as many as there are children in his family. Due to some rather interesting families, let the child decide who to include in his family.
