

Jordan Crossing Card

Supplies

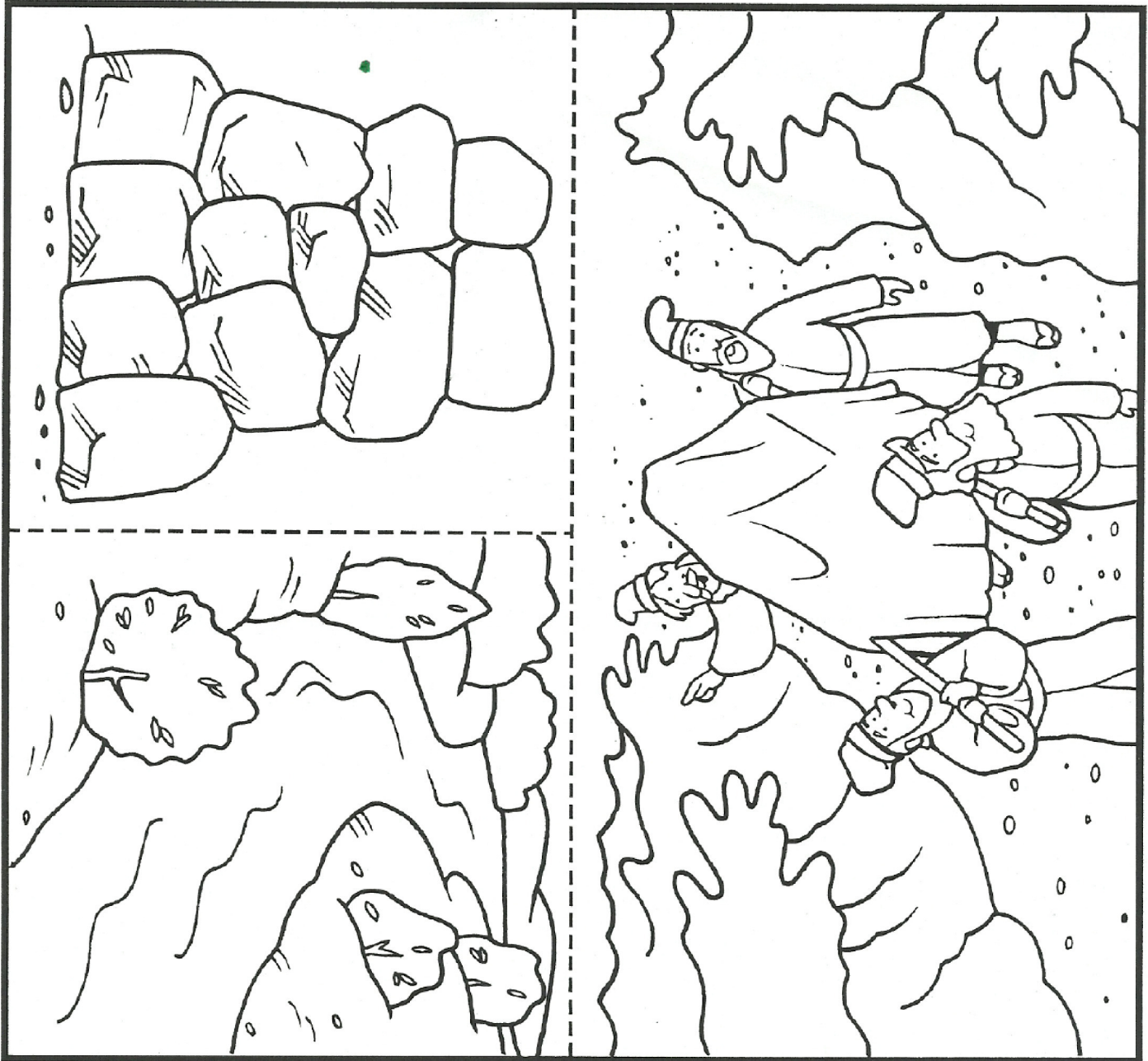
- copies of the card (1 per child)
- crayons or washable markers
- scissors

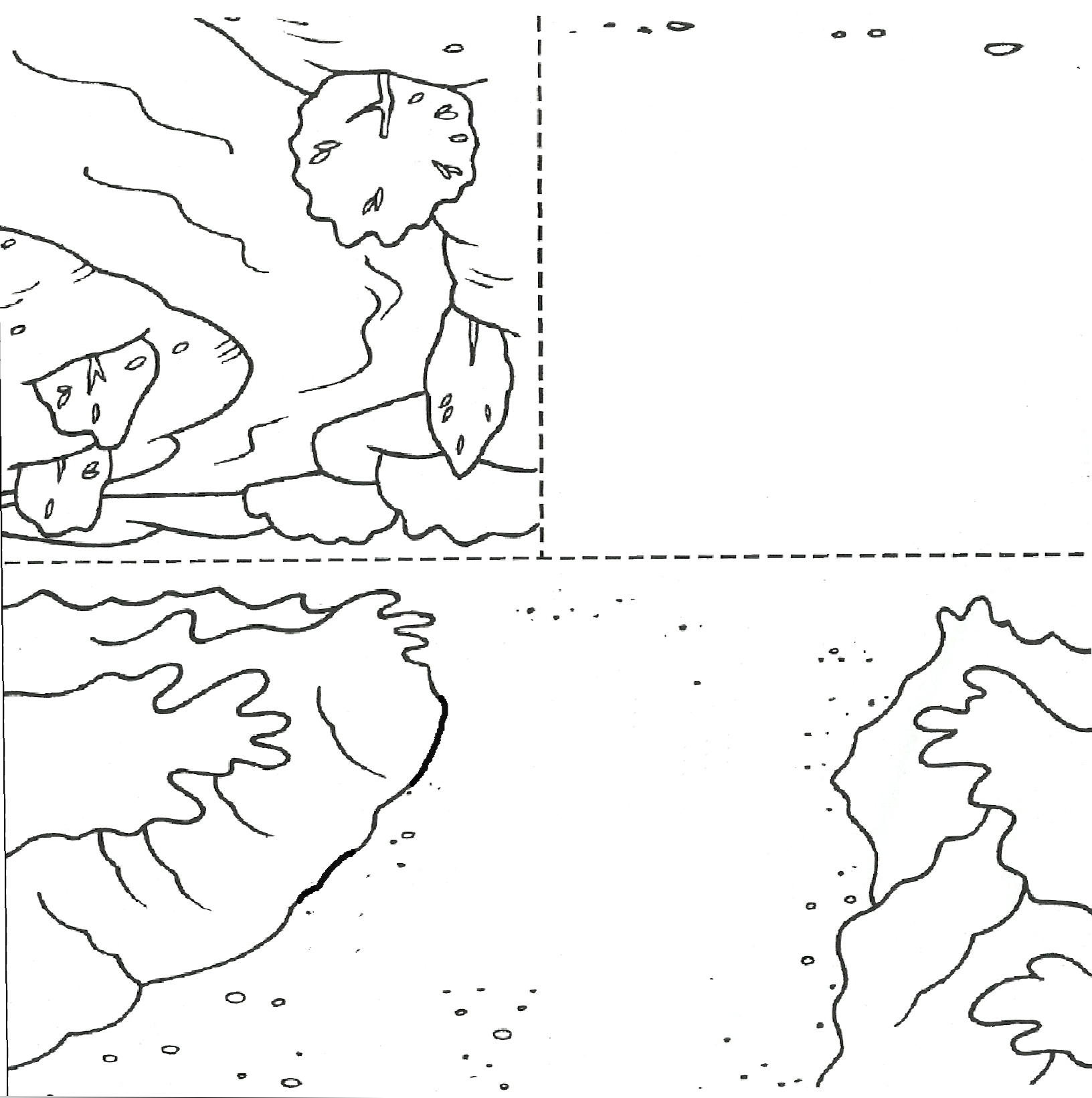


Directions

Help children color and cut out the cards on the outer line. Fold each card back along the long dotted line so that the scenes are back to back. Fold the card in half again along the short dotted line so that the people crossing the river are folded inside the card. Children can use the cards to retell the story of God's people crossing the Jordan River:

- 1) The Jordan River was flowing but God promised to part it for His people to cross.
- 2) God parted the river and the people walked through on dry land.
- 3) The people built an altar to God using 12 stones they collected from the dry river floor (children can count the stones in the altar) as a reminder of what God did that day.





Print on copy paper. Color if desired or let children color in class. Glue priests with ark on dry river bed, rocks cut from brown paper for altar and make waves with glue squiggles on full river.



Copy on copy paper. Color if desired or let children color in class. Let children glue priests and ark on dry river bed. Let children either construct their own altar out of 12 stones (cut from brown paper) or color this one and glue in box that is basically empty.
